



Gas Injection Informed Consent

We are going to attempt to reduce infection and discomfort around your tooth or inside the jaw joint area by injecting activated oxygen into the area.

There is minor discomfort during the procedure, which usually takes less than a minute. The area may be slightly tender for a short time afterwards. It is extremely unlikely you will need any medications to be comfortable following the procedure.

It is possible there might be minor bruising in the area, but that's highly improbable.

You may stop the procedure at any time for any reason if you choose. To do this it is best to signal your treating doctor. When done, you may note a light medicinal taste in the mouth. It is permissible to rinse and eat immediately, but follow the directions of your operating dentist in this regard.

It is difficult to predict how any particular patient will respond to the use of activated oxygen materials. There have been no reported injuries from other tests of this procedure. We do not predict any damage to the teeth or gums.

Please make notes of any symptoms of any sort that you experience following the procedure, so that you can share this information with us at your check up visit.

IT IS IMPORTANT THAT WE EXAMINE YOU. Your operator will tell you when you will need to be examined again and the need for follow up x-rays or other treatments.

Duration of this study will be approximately 3 years. Participation on your part is completely voluntary, and you may stop at any time without prejudice.
